Friday, April 23, 2010 from 9:30 am to 11:30 am

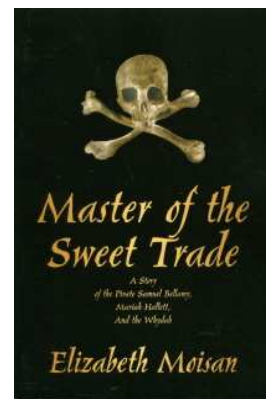
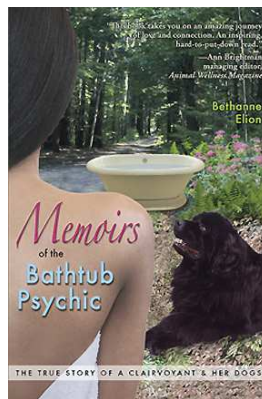

### **GORDON MATHIESON: *The Color of Ice***

Gordon Mathieson is the author of three previous books: "Quissett," "The Hyannis House" and "The Greater Boston Challenge." His fourth is a contemporary thriller set on the South Shore and features Carrie Bock, a Tufts University professor and researcher, who is recruited by the government to work in a top-secret biomedical laboratory. Bock comes into contact with a type of high-tech racial profiling that challenges her ethics and emotions regarding love, sex and loyalty.

### **BETHANNE ELION: *Memoirs of the Bathtub Psychic***

This debut memoir is the heartwarming true story of a woman's relationship with her Newfoundland dogs, who teach her to trust the psychic abilities she was afraid to acknowledge for many years and to cultivate her instincts for holistic healing and animal communication. A compelling read for all animal lovers.

### **ELIZABETH MOISAN: *Master of the Sweet Trade: A Story of the Pirate Samuel Bellamy, Mariah Hallett, and the Whydah***

Set in the early 1700s, this fictional and fascinating account of the swashbuckling pirate Samuel Bellamy chronicles his lust for gold; for the accused Cape Cod witch, Mariah Hallett; and for the treasure ship, the *Whydah*. The wreck and recovery of the *Whydah* and her vast treasure are renowned and Ms. Moisan's novel adds yet another facet to this intriguing saga. She is also a successful artist and the founder of A Book in the Hand, a monthly program for local authors of published prose.
