



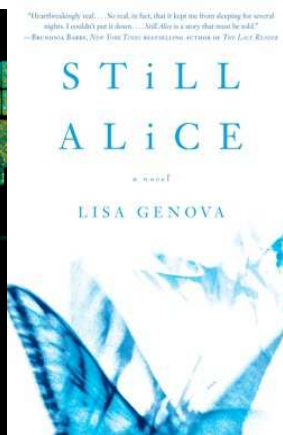
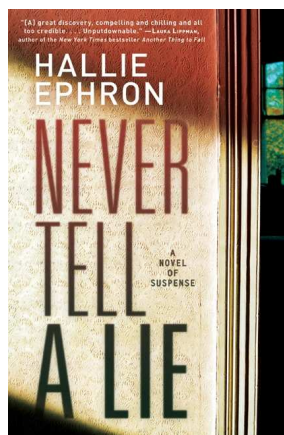

Hallie is an award-winning mystery reviewer for the *Boston Globe*. She is the author of *1001 Books for Every Mood* and *Writing and Selling Your Mystery*, which was nominated for both an Edgar and an Anthony award. *Never Tell a Lie* is a novel of suspense centered around a seemingly perfect couple, David and Ivy. Betrayal, distrust, and obsession pave the way for a fast-paced thriller you won't be able to put down.

LISA GENOVA: STILL ALICE

Still Alice is a compelling debut novel about a 50-year old woman's descent into early onset alzheimer's disease. Winner of the 2008 Bronte Prize, it was released on January 6, 2009 and debuted at #5 on the New York Times Bestseller list. It was originally self-published for almost a year before it was bought at auction by Simon & Schuster. Lisa lives in Chatham, with her husband, documentary filmmaker and photographer Christopher Seufert, and two children.

BRENT RUNYON: SURFACE TENSION: A NOVEL IN FOUR SUMMERS

Drawing upon his own experiences and summers spent at his vacation home, Brent Runyon gives his readers a story about growing up that all teenagers will be able to relate to.
